**Racers & Team Managers:**

**“NEW INFORMATION – SPORT OPEN”**

**The snowmobile manufacturers and the (ISR) International Snowmobile Racing require all racing circuits to eliminate the Sport Open class effective immediately based on safety concerns with inexperienced racers competing on Open class sleds and the high cost of purchasing and maintaining Open class race sleds.**

**ISR has informed us that they will not sanction any race that includes “Sport Open” we therefore have no choice but to eliminate this class.**

The following changes will be in affect at CSRA races. All other CSRA rules and classes remain the same as 2007. Please review 2008 CSRA Newsletter #1 for details.

**Traction Products “Stud Placement Clarification”**

- The stud must be located a minimum of 4.25 inches from the edge of the track measured parallel to the surface of the track and measured from the track edge to the outside edge of the stud shaft.

**CSRA Pro & Semi-Pro Classes:**

The feature Pro and Semi-Pro Stock classes will now be called Super Stock 600. Super Stock classes do not permit 440cc race sleds to compete against 600cc sleds.

Pro and Semi-Pro racers competeing in the Super Stock classes must race with a Stock 600cc 2-Stroke snowmobile or Stock Four Stroke snowmobiles with a maximum displacement of 1050cc.

In addition to the new Super Stock 600 classes, CSRA will continue to offer a Semi-Pro Stock class for 0–600cc Stock race sleds including the 440s.

The existing Pro and Semi-Pro Open 600cc class has not changed.

There are new classes for Pro Veteran racers 30+ years, and Pro Masters 40 + years.

### **CSRA Sport Classes:**

All our Stock Sport classes will remain the same as last year. 440s are still permitted in all CSRA Sport classes.

### **CSRA will not offer a Sport Open class.**

This year we have added a Sport Veteran 30+ years, and Sport Masters 40+ years.

### **CSRA Trail Sport Classes:**

The 500cc & 600cc Stock Trail Sport classes will remain the same as last year.

The Trail Sport Open Class has been eliminated.

### **CSRA Junior Classes:**

The Junior classes remain the same as last season.

The new 600cc Super Stock snowmobiles are not permitted in Junior classes.

### **CSRA 120cc Classes:**

The 120cc Stock classes have been revised as follows.

#### **Stock 120cc**

- No modifications of any type except the governor may be disabled.
- Ages 4 - 9 years of age.
- Speed limit of 12 mph. enforced by rules and radar.

#### **Improved Stock 120cc**

- Rules are the same as the 2007 Stock 120cc classes.
- Ages 4 – 9 years of age.
- Speed limit of 15 mph. enforced by rules and radar.

#### **Modified 120cc**

- Rules are the same as the 2007 season.
- Ages 7 – 9 years of age.

### **120cc Information Notice:**

- 120cc racers that are 8 or 9 years of age may also compete in the Novice A 300cc class.
- The Modified 120cc class will be eliminated after the 2007/2008 season and may be replaced with a larger displacement Improved Stock Class to reduce modification expenses. (Details to be voted on and finalized at the 2008 annual drivers meeting).
