## Realm Racing visits Georgian Downs, Innisfil Ontario



Georgian Downs in Innisfil, Ontario was the site for CSRA Rounds 5 and 6. It's a great venue that allows fans the opportunity to watch either inside behind the glass staying comfy and warm, or venture out into the cold to battle the elements and smell the exhaust fumes as sleds pass by.

This past weekend's unseasonably warm temperatures, sunshine and blue skies were a welcomed treat except for the deteriorating snow conditions. With daytime highs of 8°C the CSRA had to work hard to keep the track in decent shape. Both our riders sustained minor injuries, Meghan wore her bars in the chest knocking the wind out of her, and Lindsey landed hard twisting her ankle while riding under some rough track conditions. The girls continued to push through the minor inconveniences and finish all of their races this weekend.



Saturday's racing during the first heat of Junior Girls had Meghan fighting hard for a top 5 spot for the entire race and narrowly missing it finishing up 6<sup>th</sup> while Lindsey followed up close behind in 7<sup>th</sup>. Their first heat of Transition girls was a reversal Lindsey pushed hard taking a top five at the finish line with Meghan finishing up in 7<sup>th</sup>. Their second heats of the day were

pushed to the end of the day until the Pro's finished leaving them sitting around waiting for hours. By this time the track was a terrible mess with pools of water and slushy snow making it hard for them to turn their Polaris snowmobiles. During the Transition Girls second heat Lindsey finished 8<sup>th</sup> and Meghan 9<sup>th</sup>. Last heat of the day was Junior Girls, I was happy to see both girls go out and finish up the day with Lindsey in 7<sup>th</sup> and Meghan in 8<sup>th</sup>.

Sunday was a new day and overnight temperatures cooled down enough to freeze things up again. Although the girls weren't 100% they weren't going to give up without a fight. There was lots of close racing in both classes. Junior Girls had Lindsey finishing 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> in her heats for a 6<sup>th</sup> overall on the day. Meghan finished 8<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> for a 9<sup>th</sup> overall. In Transition Girls Lindsey finished 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> overall while Meghan went 8<sup>th</sup>, 8<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup>.

Both girls are racing each other hard and starting to launch off the starting line. With both of them back to 100% we will again see them charging hard during Rounds 7 and 8.



The next race is The Eclipse Financial Cup National Snowcross located in Timmins, Ontario March 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup>. There's always an abundance of snow and lots of fans to race in front of, hope to see you there!
